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As an honorary society that celebrates students' participation and achievements in interscholastic speaking contests, the National Forensic League motivates students to succeed in one of the most important lifelong skills: communication. For more information, see http://www.nationalforensicleague.org/honorsociety. Earning service points must meet the following guidelines:

- 1. Limits: Up to 200 service points may be reported per year, and service activities can only be retroactively recorded for the current and immediate past school years. Students may not record points in both contest and service speaking (this includes final rounds that may have an audience of more than 25 adults). See additional limits by type of service enumerated below.
- 2. Audience Speaking Engagements: presentations must be at least <u>four minutes</u>, made before live audiences of at least 25 adults (persons beyond high school age), or broadcast on television or radio (school P.A. announcements and Internet broadcasts are <u>not</u> allowed). Name specifically as: Rotary Club, PTA, High School Assembly, Radio WHBC. Describe the type of speaking, but not title or subject (e.g., Master of Ceremonies, After Dinner Speech, Book Review, Oration, Commentating, Persuasive Speech, Public Debate, Declamation, Panel Discussion, Interpretive Reading, Sales Talk, Sermon, Sportscasting, Storytelling, Impromptu, Extemporaneous Speech, TV & Radio Announcing).
- 3. **Judging**: High school students (of any League degree level) may receive up to two points per round, up to four rounds per day, for judging novice or middle school competition.
- 4. **Middle School Coaching**: High school students may earn two points per day for coaching <u>middle school</u> practice sessions, which does not include tournaments. A maximum of 50 points per year may be recorded for coaching.
- 5. Theatrical Performance Speaking: Students may earn points for acting/theatrical performances and/or theatre/festival competition.
 - a. Students earn five points for each performance of a play in front of an audience or in competition
 - b. Max. of 20 points for any particular play or for a particular competitive readers theatre selection, one act team, ensemble, choral reading group, etc.
 - c. Mime and non-speaking roles may not earn points.
